


A researcher can share a name, or change their name, or use their middle name or initial, or their name could be spelt differently, or have an accent...

WHAT IS ORCID?

- An identifier for researchers
- A registry
- A set of standard procedures for connecting researchers to their affiliations and activities
- A committed community building connectors
- An international-scale open research effort



D ORCID provides a persistent digital identifier that distinguishes researchers from each other



ORCID's vision is a world where all who participate in research, scholarship, and innovation are uniquely identified and connected to their contributions across disciplines, borders, and time.




THE ORCID COMMUNITY



Mandating the use of Open Researcher and Contributor ID (ORCID) by submitting authors.

ORCID provides a unique identifier for all researchers that can be linked to their different research works and activities across multiple platforms. It also serves to distinguish authors with similar names and simplify searching of publications databases (such as PubMed, Scopus, etc.) to avoid retrieving articles by authors with similar names. Close to 1.8 million researchers have already created their ORCID iD. The service is non-profit and community driven.



From 1 January 2016, we will require the submitting author to provide an ORCID identifier as part of the manuscript submission process. Details of the practicalities will be provided shortly, but don't worry, it takes less than a minute to register for an ORCID iD and it's free of charge. A <u>recent survey</u> carried out by ORCID indicates strong support in the research community for mandates by publishers, funders, and universities.
